1. See General Information page 9
2. Goats will be judged concurrently with 4-H goats on Monday at 10:30 a.m.
3. Goats must be in place by Sunday, preceding Fair, at 2:00 p.m. All show animals must remain on the grounds all week. Goats will be released at 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, last day of Fair.
4. Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per age class per breed. Only 1 entry per specialty class (18-24).
5. ADGA rules will govern.
6. All animals must be identified by a legible registration tattoo or a USDA approved official identification tag. There will be no pre-show milk-out. Overdistended udders are subject to discrimination. The judge's decision is final. All goats are entered at the sole risk of the owners. Base date for computing the age of goats for classes is the date of the show.
7. Registration papers will be presented to the show Secretary before the show begins. Proof of ownership shall be the name on the registration or recordation certificate or stamped duplicate application.
8. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals must compete for Best Doe in Show.
9. All animals show in group or special classes must have been show in their regular class.
10. An official health certificate will be required for all entries. All entries must be health-checked prior to the show. Any animals showing signs of contagious disease or condition will be dismissed and prohibited from the show. Rules and standards of the NYS Dept of Ag & Markets for the conduct of Fairs and Live-stock Health Requirements shall apply.
11. Specialty classes are judged by breed.
12. Age of animals as follows:
 - Junior Doe Show (under 2 years & never milked)
 - Junior Kid - born between April 1 of current year & show date
 - Intermediate Kid - born between March 1 & March 31 of current year
 - Senior Kid - born between Jan. 1 & Feb. 29 of current year
 - Junior Yearling - born between May 1 & Dec. 31 of preceding year
 - Senior Yearling - born between Aug. 5, two years ago, & April 30, previous year
 - Senior Doe Show (does in milk or have ever milked) – see class numbers for age.
13. Show order will be numerical according to section number.
14. All goats will comply to the new Scrapie Eradication program. All animals will either have an assigned premises ID number or tattoo on each animal.
15. Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per age class per breed. Only 1 entry per specialty class (#12-16)

DEPARTMENT H - SHEEP

2. Sheep will be judged Wednesday, following the 4-H show, at 12:00 p.m.
3. Sheep must be in place Sunday, preceding Fair, by 2:00 p.m. and will be released Sunday, last day of Fair, at 6:00 p.m.
4. All sheep will comply to the new Scrapie Eradication program. Check NYS regulations.
5. Animals from a flock under quarantine for any reason cannot be exhibited.
6. No animal will be allowed to unload until examined.
7. All purebred exhibits must be registered in a recognized breeders association and carry association ear tags. Papers will be presented to the superintendent.
8. An exhibitor is limited to 2 entries in each class but may not receive more than 2 premiums in each individual class and 1 premium in each group class.
9. A Flock shall consist of 1 ram, any age, and 3 ewes, any age.
10. All breeding sheep should be properly fitted and trimmed. Unworthy animals will receive no awards.
11. Rosettes will be awarded for champion Ram and Ewe in each breed.
